IBC North America expands by adding AGRIBC Super Facility in Upper Midwest USA

Clarkston, Michigan, USA – December 23, 2010

IBC North America has formally announced it is expanding to meet demand for new IBCs and IBC and container recycling services by opening a state of the art facility in the Upper Midwest of the USA. This new facility follows IBC North America's strategic focus on AG CHEM with its AGRIBC division.

This new facility will house equipment to produce IBC North America's New Passport IBC as well as recycle used IBCs and other containers.

The company has acquired state of the art blow molding machines and cage line equipment to provide for this super facility. In addition, equipment has been purchased for the recycling effort including large capacity shredders and the company's state of the art washing system.

The new facility, whose specific location is yet to be publicly announced, will be open for business in the second quarter of 2011.

This location is IBC North America's third IBC manufacturing facility, complimenting the companies Clarkston, Michigan and Lawrenceville, Georgia facilities. The AGRIBC recycling plant joins the company's network of recycling centers in Clarkston, Michigan; Stanton, Kentucky; Robertsedale, Alabama; and Perris California.

"This new facility allows us to be closer to our existing and potential customer base in the AG belt of the USA. It also provides relief for our existing facilities that are at or near full capacity", commented Dick Harding, President and CEO of IBC North America. "These are exciting times for our family business. Our group of companies was started 65 years ago by our Grand Father,



Austin Harding, who made his first containers on the family farm in DeWitt Iowa. Our new AGRIBC facility fits our history and culture. Plus, it meets the needs of our customers.”
